CELP Students Return from Brazil


Students from Limestone's Christian Education and Leadership Program returned on March 25, after spending their Spring Break on a mission trip to Brazil. The group brought the gospel to children and families living in despairing circumstances in one of Brazil's poorest areas, Curitiba. For two families, they launched and enabled the construction of indoor bathrooms and assisted in the construction of a home for abused, neglected, and/or orphaned children.

Twelve Limestone students went on the mission trip, eleven of whom were members of CELP. They were Morgan Bell, Patrick Burnett, Nate Cooke, Latoya English, Tyler Epperly, Sara Ferguson, Jaclyn Fields, Rachel Huch, JD Revels, Jr, Stacy Riggins, Justin Wheeler, and Roger Yarbrough. The students were accompanied by College Chaplain and CELP Director Reverend Ron Singleton.

"We have all shared an experience this week which has reached each of us in a unique way, from coloring and teaching Bible stories to children, to painting, to digging a trench through a road," Singleton said. "And unforgettable fellowship with our Brazilian brothers and sisters, who must be the most hospitable and generous people in the world."

Dr. David Thompson Releases CD of Civil War Piano Music

Limestone College Professor of Music Dr. David B. Thompson has released a compact disc of Civil War piano music by Southern composers, entitled *Confederates at the Keyboard*. The album comes after the overwhelming success of his live presentation, "Confederates at the Keyboard – Piano Music During the Civil War Era." Included on the compact disc are marches, Civil War dance pieces such as the waltz, polka and schottische, Civil War song arrangements, and concert pieces.

"As I continued to present these lecture-performances, members of the audience would always ask if I had these wonderful pieces recorded, so I finally did it," Thompson said.

The project has received enthusiastic reviews from piano music lovers and Thompson's colleagues, such as John Kenneth Adams, Distinguished Professor Emeritus of the School of Music at the University of South Carolina.

"His playing is lean, clean and unaffected, giving one the feeling that this is being heard just as it may have sounded in the Civil War era," Adams praised. "A must for Civil War buffs and all music libraries."

The release of the compact disc coincides with Limestone College's ongoing fund raising efforts to restore the Winnie Davis Hall of History, an academic building on the College campus named after the Daughter of the Confederacy. "This is the music that Winnie Davis was hearing in parlors and concert halls throughout the South," Thompson explained.

Confederates at the Keyboard can be purchased for \$15 from the Office of Institutional Advancement at Limestone College, \$5 of which goes directly to the Campaign to Restore the Winnie Davis Hall of History. 


Student Directors Offer A Night of the Stars


Alumni Return to Campus April 20-22

Watts '55 Named Philanthropist of the Year

Limestone College honored alumna and trustee Pat Plyler Watts as its 2007 Philanthropist of the Year Wednesday, March 21, at the Capital City Club in Columbia.

Watts has supported many of Limestone College's programs, projects, and capital campaigns over the years, including the recently constructed P.E. Center (in which the fitness center is named in her honor), the Limestone Fund, and the school's endowment. She is also a member of the College's Board of Trustees and the Advancement Committee. Watts currently

serves as the chair of the Campaign to Restore Winnie Davis, one of Limestone's historic academic buildings. She continues to advance this very important project as well as many other Limestone endeavors by strongly encouraging other alumni to support Limestone.

Originally from Lancaster, Watts graduated from Limestone in 1955 with a bachelor of arts degree in home economics. She taught middle school for 11 years in Rock Hill and Columbia, while earning a master's degree from Winthrop. Between 1966 and 1976, Watts operated a private

camp for girls and wrote a guidebook for camp counselors. She and her husband then moved to Lewisville, Texas, where she founded the Lewisville Education Foundation and was a member of the Lewisville Independent School District Board. When she was on the Board of Directors for the American Cancer Society in both Lewisville and the State of Texas, fundraising reached record highs. Pat and Jim have four grown children and reside in Camden where they remain involved in many community activities.
