

Transfer Credit Guide BA Liberal Studies

The list identifies courses taken at South Carolina Technical Colleges, which fulfill one of the general education or major course requirements. You are not required to take all courses listed prior to transferring. Rather, it is a guide for you and your advisors. * You should be aware that courses must be passed with *a grade of C or higher* in order to be considered for transfer credit. Students will take **ID 120, 150 or 201** *and 301* with Limestone, as part of the general education requirements. Students transferring 30 credits or more and Extended Campus students will take ID 201.
